Ematai's learning programs for Orthodox Jewish women in North America explore the questions that arise when Jewish law confronts the realities of illness, death and dying. Topics include risky treatments, prayers for the terminally ill, life-saving interventions, and code status. The programs are taught by Rabbi Dr. Shlomo Brody and Rabbi Dr. Jason Weiner alongside distinguished guest speakers.

ADVANCED STUDY FELLOWSHIP

THE ADVANCED STUDY FELLOWSHIP IS DESIGNED FOR WOMEN WITH A BACKGROUND IN ADVANCED TORAH STUDY WHO ARE DEEPLY PASSIONATE ABOUT JEWISH COMMUNAL SERVICE.

Program structure:

- Year-long program with regular assessments covering the major sugyot in end-of-life halacha, with 6-8 hours per week studying primary halachic texts and contemporary psak
- Rigorous asynchronous text study combined with virtual bi-weekly faculty sessions
- Two in-person gatherings
- September 2026 - July 2027

\$10,000 stipend

EXECUTIVE TRACK

THE EXECUTIVE TRACK IS DESIGNED FOR WOMEN WHO ARE ALREADY ENCOUNTERING DILEMMAS OF AGING OR END-OF-LIFE CARE IN THEIR WORK, SUCH AS CLINICIANS, SOCIAL WORKERS, THERAPISTS, REBBETZINS, OR BIKUR CHOLIM VOLUNTEERS.

Program structure:

- 11 bi-weekly 90-minute virtual shiurim
- Structured exploration of the mitzvot related to supporting sick and dying individuals and building familiarity with the major halachic discussions in end-of-life care
- October 2026 - April 2027

\$500 stipend & eligible for 10 CME credits
